Dear Parents and Carers,

We are very excited to share the exciting changes that we will be making over the next few months. We have plans to move our nursery classrooms into the main school building so that they feel a part of the wider school community. Nursery will be moving into the current Reception classroom, once the updates have been made, and we are drawing up the plans to allow this to happen. We are hoping that the new nursery classroom will be able to open for the start of the new term in September but will keep you updated with the details of this. As part of this work, we are also planning to renovate our Reception courtyard which will create more space for both Reception and Nursery classes to use.

These changes mean that Fir - (Reception), Willow - (Year 1) and Maple (Year 2) will all be moving classrooms to the next classroom. We have started the work to allow this to happen and are preparing our spare classroom so that Year 2 will be able to move in the next few weeks. This will not affect their learning as the classroom will be ready for the day that they move. This will then also allow us to move the other two classes. Class teachers will let you know when these changes will happen.

The Nursery building will then become a learning support space for any of our pupils who need additional support and interventions and will be a brilliant resource for the pupils of Longlands.

The final half-term is always very busy so please see the attached list of key dates for the rest of the term. The newsletter will also continue to have an overview of the next few weeks to help as a reminder.

It has been another glorious week of weather so now is a good time for a reminder for children to be prepared for the sunshine.
